160th Anniversary

Touro Infirmary celebrated its 160th anniversary of caring for generations of Taking care of New Orleans for generations families in New Orleans. Hospital founder, Judah Touro saw a need for medical care for newly arrived German and Irish immigrants, slaves and sailors who docked in the city. Touro Infirmary opened as the first not-forprofit and faith-based hospital in the city August 18, 1852. Built on a tradition of excellent care, community involvement and faith, Touro continues to be a vital institution for healthcare in the city.



3,000th Baby

Touro is known as the place "where babies come from." And with the birth of the hospital's 3,000th baby in 2012, that is truer than ever. The hospital could not have reached that milestone without the support of the dedicated physicians, nurses, lactation consultants and ancillary staff that help make each birth experience at Touro an unforgettable one.



Commission on Cancer Accreditation

Touro Infirmary's Cancer Center was granted a Three-Year Accreditation with Commendation by the Commission on Cancer (CoC) of the American College of Surgeons (ACoS). Of over 500 programs surveyed in 2011, only 104 programs nationwide achieved the CoC Outstanding Achievement Award status and Touro is the only hospital in New Orleans to receive this distinction. This elite designation reflects the quality of Touro's comprehensive, multidisciplinary patient care.



The Harry T. Howard III Memorial Infusion Center

Touro Infirmary opened its newly renovated infusion center conveniently located on the first floor near the Foucher Street entrance. The new center will double the hospital's chemotherapy treatment capacity and provides free supportive cancer care services. Through the generous support of the Elise M. Besthoff Foundation, Inc., patients can participate in art and music therapy, and surf the net or watch movies on iPads in the center while receiving treatment.



Head and Neck Center
